Well, In this, my one year anniversary issue as your editor, I had hoped to regale you with stories of an incredible fly-in adventure to Big Bend. Luck was on your side though, because the weather, once again changed for the worse and kept me grounded. So sitting here with a deadline looming and the ever present threat of having to reduce this issue even more than it already has been this month, it struck me that I could go rummaging through the Flappings archives and pull up something in the way of a timeless article. So....drum roll please...here we go from the March 2004 issue. Enjoy!

### The Flying Safety Corner

More than once, I have heard survival instructors say the most important survival tool is the one between your ears. I am sure they were correct; however, having a survival kit in your plane can make a huge difference in how well you do in your "survival experience".

A survival kit doesn't have to be big – actually the more you have sometimes inhibits your imagination. So, how much of what do we need? Here are some ideas to justify what I've carried in my survival kit.

My kit bag is a small bright red backpack. You don't need camouflage as long as you aren't trying to evade capture. While small, it carries plenty, just not a lot of food.

After you have picked up some survival items you do not want to just throw them in the kit – try to keep it organized. I put most of my gear in re-sealable plastic food bags, and threw away the hard to open bubble cards and boxes they came in. Get the baggies with the slide openers or put some scotch tape on both sides of the top to make it easier to open with cold, wet fingers.

As you load the baggies, make an inventory of what went inside each baggie, and place the inventory inside where you can read it without opening the bag. Lists are good; I never would remember that I have a cable saw for cutting firewood, or straws from Mc Donald's which are good for starting fires.

A good survival book is an amazing help. It can give you ideas on how to build a shelter, how to do first aid, and if nothing else, the pages that do not apply to your current predicament make good fire starters! A great basic book is the Boy Scout Handbook, but there are plenty of good books available. I keep mine in a front pocket with a knife, a pair of light sticks, and collapsible pliers.

My first aid kit is a small 5 X 6 inch zippered bag that was sold packaged as a first aid kit for hunters. It may be better set up for gunshot wounds than torn metal cuts, but we have to limit this somewhere!

For shelter I'm probably over-equipped. I have two Thermos brand Sportsman's Blankets and two Space blankets, all of them are shiny silver on one side and the sportsman blankets are bright orange on the flip side. I like staying dry and out of the wind. If I tie them together, I have a small tent.

Inside the blankets I packed breakables and flat items like: a signal mirror, a pair of compasses, those straws from McDonald's, a plastic Fresnel lens and dry tinder.

While I don't have much food, just one MRE packet, I do have fish hooks (Just in case I'm downed close to a trout stream). Food is one item that does not have an indefinite shelf life in a survival kit.

All right, here you are, having a lousy day. You just crunched your Eagle close to Nowhere, Texas, you're OK, but you didn't file a flight plan. First aid, shelter, and fire are your first got-to-do's. You may not need much of your survival gear here in the states because of ELTs and Rescue should pick you up in a few hours. "Should" is the critical word here and people have died because they did not shift gears into the survival mode fast enough.

You must to be ready to spend the night before rescue shows up. You may spend a couple of *days* and nights in the weeds if your ELT failed or the weather gets bad. If all you do is fix yourself up, make a shelter, and cook dinner before rescue shows up, you will have kept busy, and you can at least offer them some burnt, out-of-season trout with mushy MRE's on the side. Hey, when I'm cooking, every day is a survival situation!
